## PE and Sport Premium should be used in such a way that it has a positive impact on the following key performance indicators:

The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity - the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people

aged 5 to 18 engage in at least 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school

**Key Indicator 2:** The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement

Key Indicator 3: Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport

**Key Indicator 4:** Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils

**Key Indicator 5:** Increased participation in competitive sport

## Our broad aims for our PE and Sports Premium in 2023-2024 are:

- To continue to further increase staff confidence and ability to teach and assess PE.
- To provide professional development for all staff on OAA.
- To upskill another member of the St. Peter's teaching team to be able to lead PE across the school.
- To embed a new PE assessment framework, based on our progression of skills.
- To continue to increase the proportion of learners meeting the end of KS2 expectations in swimming.
- To further develop the PE co-ordinators strategic management of PE, including evaluating effectiveness and impact of provision and spending.
- To encourage all learners to lead healthy and active lives both in and out of school, providing them with enrichment opportunities that give them experience of a wide-range of activities and sports.
- To ensure there is an engaging lunchtime experience on offer to all learners.
- To offer a broad range of sports and activities that engage learners in 60 minutes of physical activity a day, including through cross-curricular learning, lunchtimes, after-school clubs, an engaging curriculum and enrichment days.
- To raise the profile of physical activity within the school and wider community.
- To open the door to competitions for all our learners, increasing participation across all age groups.
